You are visiting the North Carolina “Piedmont,” meaning the “foot of the mountains.” Looking north from Winston-Salem, one can see the distinctive profiles of Pilot Mountain and Saurtown Mountain. These serve as a gateway to the Blue Ridge Mountain Range, which defines the northwest border of North Carolina. You can drive to the Pilot Mountain State Park or Hanging Rock State Park at Saurtown in about a half an hour and to the Blue Ridge Parkway in under an hour.

Another reason to go exploring northward is the vineyards. There are now over a dozen fully operational wineries, many providing “tastings” and some with restaurants. Overall, the countryside north of Winston-Salem offers endless two-lane country roads with plenty of curves and changes of elevation plus views of gor-

geous landscapes, mountain overlooks, old time farm sites and old homesteads. Go for the destinations or just go for the drive.

The North Carolina “Triad” is not only a place of scenery; it is a manufacturing center encompassing three major North Carolina cities: Winston-Salem, Greensboro and High Point. In High Point, Thomasville and Lexington, you can find just about any piece of furniture you desire at very low prices. Since you probably won’t want to put that new dining room table in the back of the Healey, you will be glad to hear that these stores will “ship it.” Other Triad cities are home to textile manufacturing, home furnishing fabrication, tobacco processing, specialty food production and clothing manufacturing. All of these industries operate retail and discount stores.

Shopping, in general, seems to be a favorite pastime of Conclave participants, and you will not be disappointed this year. Winston-Salem’s Hanes Mall is one of the largest malls between Washington, D.C., and Atlanta. Perhaps you prefer smaller shops? Spend the day in Winston-Salem downtown or on Stratford Road or in Reynolda Village. Rather see small town stores and shops? Try Kernersville, Rural Hall, Germantown or Mount Airy. Want more big cities? Greensboro, High Point, Charlotte, Raleigh and Asheville...all within one or two hours drive.

North Carolina is considered the birthplace of NASCAR, and you are right in the middle of the action. Many of the NASCAR racing teams have their shops and museums in the Triad. There is even a North Carolina Auto Racing Hall of Fame. Lowe’s Motor Speedway in Charlotte is about an hour away and right here in Winston-Salem is NASCAR’s oldest continuously operating paved track at Bowman Gray Stadium.

At a slower pace, take a walking tour of our city. The downtown is developing a sidewalk café ambiance right outside your hotel. Walk a few blocks to Historic West End or walk to famous Old Salem, a recreation of an 18<sup>th</sup> century Moravian community. Want to get out in the Healey? It’s a short drive across town to the Southeastern Center for Contemporary Arts or the Museum of Early Southern Decorative Arts. Enjoy the drive. Winston-Salem doesn’t have a “Rush Hour.” It’s more of a “Hurry along now, ya’ll hear?”
